Before Election Day:

- If you have a new address, get a voter registration application to make the change of address with the local board of elections. If you think you've made the change, check the voter look-up website. You may also make changes online at Maryland's Online Voter Registration System.
- Your voter registration card lists your polling location. Check the voter look-up website to ensure that the polling location listed is correct.
- The deadline to change your party affiliation is June 3, 2014.
- You may vote at 18-years-old if you are registered with either the Democratic or Republican Party.
- During early voting, you can vote at any early voting center in the jurisdiction where you live. During the general election, you should vote at the polling location where you live.
