Update on Medical Marijuana Dispensaries

In the November edition of CSCA News, we reported on the activism of CSCA board members on the medical marijuana issue. CSCA board members, pastors and other concerned citizens worked together to encourage the County Council to take responsible action on the zoning bill for medical marijuana establishments. In November, we staged a protest at the County Administration building in advance of a Council hearing on the zoning law. Our advocacy was instrumental in getting County Council to increase the distance dispensaries can locate near schools and parks. We were successful with the help of Councilman Patterson who introduced an amendment to include daycares, recreational programs and before and aftercare school uses. However, we were also working with Connect Church in Camp Springs to

encourage the County to include churches in the zoning bill. A medical marijuana dispensary plans to open shop next door to Connect Church. Instead of including churches in the bill, the County suggests they open daycares to avoid having dispensaries nearby.

We're starting to see a lot of progress in Prince George's County, particularly in commercial development. The County <u>led the</u> <u>state in job creation</u> last year, creating more than 10,600 net new jobs. That's more than any other Maryland jurisdiction, ranking 21st in the nation among large counties for job growth, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

The County broke ground in Camp Springs on the newest federal agency headquarters to come to our County in over a decade. The U.S. **Citizenship and Immigration Services** (USCIS) will bring jobs, and is expected to spur new shops and restaurants. You will soon see new development along Allentown Rd., near the Branch Ave. exit. The Allentown Gateway project will include a Lidl grocer, WAWA, townhomes and other small businesses. Other areas near us are the beneficiaries of new development as well, they include a major redevelopment in Suitland, and a new Regional Medical Center in Largo.

Maryland passed a landmark new law prohibiting price gouging by manufacturers of generic and off-patent prescription drugs. The law is designed to help make generic and off patent prescription drugs more affordable.

Prince George's County Council Leadership

The Prince George's County Council elected Council Member Dannielle Glaros (D) District 3 to serve as Chair for Legislative Year 2018. Council Member Todd Turner (D) District 4 was elected to serve as Vice Chair. The newly confirmed Council Leadership team presided over the first session of the Legislative Year 2018 on December 5, 2017. Chair Glaros and Vice Chair Turner will serve in leadership through December 4, 2018. Camp Springs is in District 8 and our Council member is Obie Patterson.

Smoke Detector Law in Effect Now

Maryland implemented a new law on Jan. 1, 2018 that requires homeowners or renters to replace their smoke detectors that are more than 10 years old and operated only by batteries, with a unit that is powered by a sealed-in, 10year battery that has a "hush" button feature. The smoke alarms are required for each floor of the house, primarily outside of bedrooms and kitchen areas. Residents can obtain a free smoke alarm by calling 311, or contacting the fire department to see if they will install one for you.

New Olive Garden Restaurant Nearby

Prince George's County's newest Olive Garden location opened at Ritchie Station Marketplace in Capitol Heights at 1681 Ritchie Station Court. The grand opening and ribbon cutting ceremony was held in December 2017. The Ritchie Station Marketplace Olive Garden is the county's fourth location, joining Bowie Town Center, The Mall at Prince George's in Hyattsville, and Towne Center Laurel.

This new location will create approximately 150 new jobs for the surrounding community. Other businesses at Ritchie Station Court include Dave & Buster's, BJ's Wholesale Club, Bed Bath & Beyond, Ashley and Regency Furniture showrooms, DSW and Pohanka's Hyundai and Volkswagen.
